Preparing for the ACT

Test prep classes? After checking with Mt. Lake Public School, we found that their juniors are sent to a one-day, off-campus spring workshop hosted by the Educational Talent Search where test prep tips and a sample test is given. The Windom Area Public School offers early morning classes in the spring for their juniors and seniors.

Tutoring? We have not been able to find a resource listing tutors in our area. Our search will continue.

Helps? MLC does not have the available staffing to host an ACT prep class. Because of this, every effort is made to inform parents and students of available resources for ACT preparation and testing via the Bear Fact and other correspondence sent home during the school year. This information is also available on our website: gomlc.org (click on the Guidance link). Some of this information is listed below including college search and some scholarship resource information.

- The Real ACT Prep Guide This resource book is available to check out from the MLC office. Students may keep it for two weeks at a time. An updated copy has just been received that includes five practice tests and test prep tips along with a CD containing college planning advice and tips, college profiles, a listing of undergraduate majors and more.
- *Kahn Academy* is a great site to "practice" or "learn" any concepts in areas students feel they are weak. Most MLC students should be familiar with this site as it has been used in our classrooms. Find it at kahnacademy.org.
- **Study breaks** Students are encouraged to use their daily study break each day to ask staff questions and to receive extra help in areas of weakness as shown on the ACT pretests. The staff wants to help students as they are able.
- <u>www.actstudent.org</u> –This website is used to register for the ACT test. Not only is this site used
 for test registration, but it also contains practice tests and tips that are helpful. See the back of

We recommend students take this test at least once by the end of their junior year to get a feel for the test. It can be taken as many times as needed to achieve a score with which they are satisfied. There is a fee for taking the test. Colleges will use a student's best score when considering admission, and some colleges use a superscore (a compilation of the highest score in each subsection, even if on different attempts) for admissions and scholarship consideration.

You should decide whether or not to take the Writing Test based on the requirements of the colleges to which you are applying or considering. The ACT website has a search tool you may use to find out if the colleges you are interested in require this portion of the test.
